

CCKC Board Meeting Minutes
July 12, 2021

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by President Paul Coleman at 7:00 pm at the main clubhouse.

Shooters are not staying as long as usual. We need to get the heaters changed over to natural gas. We need a new water heater.

AIRGUN:

Alex Modic: The range is pretty standard. Everything is going well. Still hoping for dirt for the berm. Not too many mosquitos. There is a match scheduled for this weekend.

Dirt is needed at the Airgun and Shotgun ranges. Eagle excavation has been informed.

ARCHERY:

Don Walker: This is the last weekend for the league. The banquet is scheduled for July 29th. We're busy clearing brush and we have new targets ready to go. The beaver dam is gone.

SHOTGUN:

Bill Lerch: Business was ok in June. We're hoping to be positive for the fiscal year. The Falcons won state in skeet, trap and sporting clays. They will be competing in Nationals next. We're hoping to see individual shooters during the summer. The shot reclamation is on track. Depending on the weather, we're hoping it's completed by August. We are currently getting bids for steps for the trap houses. It's becoming a safety issue. There was a motion made by Bill Lerch to install cement steps for the trap houses, not to exceed \$5000. 2nd by Scott Jackson. The motion passed. We hope to have this done before Winter. We are continuing to look into bids for a shot curtain. This is critical to protect the club. Also, we are looking to trade out the old lawn tractor for a side-by-side atv.

Black Powder:

Sue D'Aloia: Things are pretty good. Lots of action at the 22 range. Families really seem to like it and it seems to be generating interest to new shooters. It's going to be a busy week. Al Seyler will be camping with the young Marines Wednesday to Sunday. Wednesday and Thursday will be BSA shotgun merit badge days. This weekend will be a Civil War shoot.

COWBOY:

George Broecker: We hosted a match this past weekend. We had 25 shooters. The ammo shortage is affecting things. Generally, things are going ok.

CORRESPONDENCE:

OLD BUSINESS: The range brochures need to be updated and more printed up.

The security cameras at the Shotgun range should be finished by midweek. The Rifle range is next and should be done within the next 2 weeks.
